A **Lasagna Cook-off & Feast** is being held to recognize the fact former 4-H'er Jim Davis, creator of Garfield, has designed 4-H Centennial Garfield promotional items (remember, Garfield loves lasagna!). The public is invited to enter, “pay to judge” the entries and/or eat Valentino's lasagna. Feast begins at 6 p.m. Tickets are \$5 for adults, \$3 for youth 12 & under and can be purchased at the 4-H Information Booth.

- Cook-off Rules:**
- Entries are due at 5:30 p.m., Aug. 1.
 - Recipe is required with entry and must be typed or printed on 8-1/2" x 11" sheet of paper.
 - Entry must consist of 9" x 13" pan of lasagna.
 - Classes: (1) traditional, (2) nontraditional (each class must have 2 or more entries for competition).
 - 1st and 2nd place prizes in each category.
