+ 1 tsp. liquid soap) (See warning as above.) Rinse well and repeat, if necessary.
Note: Tomato juice only desensitizes the human nose to skunk odor.

Urban Wildlife Rescue at www.urbanwildliferescue.org has some unique ways to conquer the smell of skunk. When all else fails, use a professional service that may use foggers. For effectiveness of ozone treatments, see the US Environmental Protection Agency or visit www.epa.gov/iaq/pubs/ozonegen.html on the Web.

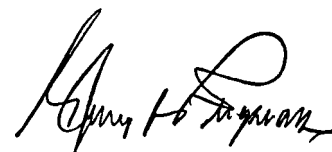
