Through all of my leadership experiences, I have gained skills that I can use throughout the rest of my life in my career and as a leader in my community.

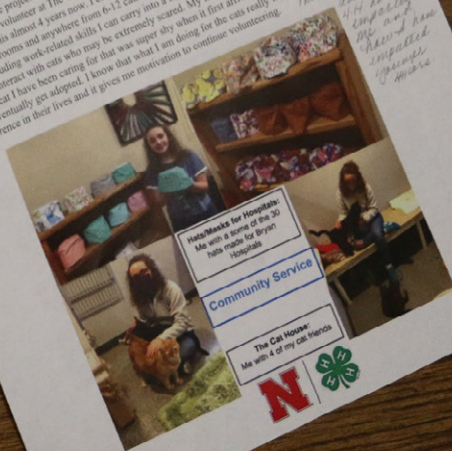


COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT/SERVICE LEARNING EXPERIENCES

Throughout high school, I have volunteered over 500 hours. About 190 of these hours were through 4-H. The two volunteer opportunities that have meant the most to me this year are the Hat/Masks for Hospitals project and the COVID-19 pandemic by the Hat/Masks for Hospitals project.

The Hat/Masks for Hospitals project was created after the COVID-19 pandemic by Lancaster County 4-H. The project took around 40 hours of service to complete. I loved making a difference in the lives of people who are keeping us safe and giving back to our community. I enjoyed doing this so much that I sewed 10 more surgeon caps for the doctor in New York City, using what I had learned through 4-H. It was amazing to know that the sewing and service skills I had used while volunteering through 4-H could be used as tools to help even more people after the project was finished.

I also volunteered at The Cat House, a no-kill cat shelter, every Sunday for about 2 hours. I have done this almost anywhere from 6-12 cats every week that I care for. I have learned so many skills including work-related skills I can carry into a future career and personal skills such as how to interact with cats who may be extremely scared. My favorite part of volunteering is when I see a cat I have been adopted for that was super shy when I first arrived, finally sit on my lap and eventually get adopted. I know that what I am doing for the cats really will make a difference in their lives and it gives me motivation to continue volunteering.

- I can make a difference in my community by working hard.

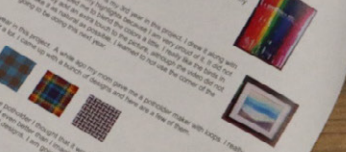
Career Spark
