

Day 1 Down covers the body. Egg tooth on the beak falls off in about a day.



Around 3 days, chicks start growing feathers called primary feathers on their wings.



Week 2 **Primary feathers start** growing on their body and tail.



Week 3 The body is fully covered by feathers.



Week 4 / Month 1 Cockerels combs (on top of head) and wattles (under beak) start to grow larger than pullets.


