CEDARS: BRIDGES (1) TRANSITIONAL LIVING& STREET OUTREACH

Offers safe housing and supportive services to homeless youth (ages 17-22), probation and state ward youth (ages 17-19) and pregnant and parenting youth who are homeless (ages 18-24).

Permanent supportive housing is available in the Southeast Service area for youth **(ages 19-24)** who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Call to fill out an eligibility form.

STREET OUTREACH: 1620 N Street; Serves ages 13-21 Monday-Friday: Noon - 6pm Saturday & Sunday: 10AM -

1pm CEDARS Street Outreach Services (SOS) provide street-based assistance to runaway, homeless and at-risk youth who can "drop-in" to receive a hot meal, do laundry, follow hygiene routines, complete job and housing applications, and receive educational support and relax.

Shelter options include communal shelter and single-family apartments. During a shelter stay, advocates and case managers work with survivors to reach their goals. Transitional housing services available.

CATHOLIC SOCIAL SERVICES: ST. GIANNA PROGRAM

Must provide ID and Social Security card for adults and birth certificates for children.

A longer-term shelter is available for eligible families and single women working towards stable, independent living. Each guest participating in this program will be assigned a PCM caseworker to help create individual goals and milestones. Offers many additional services for long term shelter residents.
