- Have adult role models/(parental) involvement
- Are facilitated by a volunteer/organizational leader who has successfully completed the Volunteer Screening
- Have members who perform a presentation or public speaking at the club level or above
- Complete one community service project
- Have members who participate in a county, district or state event(s)
- Celebrate member and club achievements
